THANKS so much once again to all those who are helping us fulfill the love of Christ JESUS to needy & broken souls! There are some of you who give financially, some who pray, some who help with record-keeping, printing & web-sites, some who are sharing with others. And then there are those in India who relay accounts, share information, get train tickets, send photos...and who are doing the hands-on ministry that we are supporting and praying for!

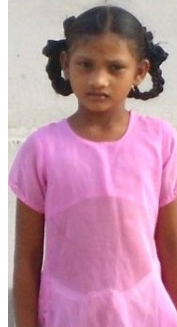
The HOPE orphanage/family in general continues to enjoy the Lord's favor in regard to their health. Seems like every few months some major fevers or sicknesses ravage the home. During the India summer (March thru June) almost always one or 2 children had a fever, but they weren't usually major and our Father has protected us from contagious things that have previously affected much of the home (chicken pox, measles, chicken guinea, fevers, stomach viruses). One boy in July was diagnosed with brain seizures, which hasn't reoccurred since. Pray for Premchand (5).

The HOPE Public School is gradually increasing in number, the latest count 35 outside children, making a total of 63 in our school (made a mistake in last month's nl, saying 26 HOPE children were in the school, when 28 is correct). The carpenters finally finished their work, so the school is done for now. Eventually we would like to finish 2 more classrooms upstairs, but it's not an urgent need now. It may take another \$5,000 or more to complete those 2 rooms. Please forgive us for many times underestimating the cost of construction; the cost of material & labor has greatly increased over the years. But aside from the financial concerns, we

have 35 incredibly beautiful children in HOPE, are now reaching out to other children thru the school, having monthly meetings for neighborhood children, semi-weekly village ministry, caring for 33 widows/widowers, providing jobs for many and training our children to make an impact on their world. As we look from a different perspective, we understand that it's been a great investment into the work of Christ in India!

MANNA PROGRAM PROFILES



VIMALAMMA: She's in her 70's, her husband dying about 30 yrs back. She has 4 daughters & 2 sons, but none of them are caring for her. She stays on her niece's verandah (porch). Used to work for a doctor, but became too weak. She's been in HMP since 2006. Pray for her, as she often has severe headaches.

SOVAMMA: She was named after one of the Hindu gods, but was converted and is now one of the more thankful widows in HMP. Possibly in her 80's (most of the widows don't know their birthdates), her husband dying around 1990. No children; lives in her own hut. Usually too weak to come to HOPE. Sending food to her.



HOPE MANNA PROGRAM UPDATE

The Manna Program at HOPE is going on well. It's always a blessing to hear the widows singing around 11am in devotions before they receive their lunch meal. Then again around 6:30 in the evening about half of them join the children for evening devotions before supper. There's 33 widows in HMP (one of those a man). There's always several who are too weak or sick to come to the home, so meals are sent to them thru another widow or helper. **Eye care:** In June eight of the widows and our widower Pitchayya had cataract surgeries, and later they and some other widows received new eyeglasses. We bore more of the costs than expected, but are thankful for favor with the eye clinic. Exams, surgeries, pain meds & glasses were all less than \$350! **New huts:** Long overdue, but finally we finished constructing new huts for Samadhanamma, Vara Lakshmi & Subbulumma. Thanks to all of you who are extending the Father's love for these needy widows!

MORE MALARIA TREATMENT IN ORISSA: Last year we were able to help our friends in tribal villages of Orissa through providing some funds for malaria treatment. Many were helped and, praise be to God, no one died in that area after treatment was given. We're praying for wisdom in regard to how best to help them. The govt. provides malaria medicine for their area every 3 months. The people put in charge sell half of it, then give priority to their relatives & friends before the remainder ever reaches the poor tribals, and it's not near enough! Many live in the jungles, they drink water from ponds & streams, keep cows, goats & other animals near or inside their homes and don't use mosquito nets. During the rainy season malaria is a big problem among them. This year, so far none have died, but some are in serious condition. PLEASE PRAY FOR THEM! In the **above photo** a nurse is in one of 7 tribal villages where she and our ministry friends held health camps, giving checkups and distributing medicines. Around 200 people were treated, mostly Christians, and some Hindus.
