REQUESTS: CHRISTMAS, GENERATOR

It's approaching that precious time again where we might focus even more on the love of our God in sending His Son to save us from the due penalty of our sins. Some may argue about the actual date of Christ's birth or the legitimacy of celebrating Christmas, but for the ministries we're connected with it is a time to saturate the people & children with teaching about sin, repentance, God's love & mercy.

Here's some needs & desires we have as Christmas draws near: **1.** We've desired to have a **generator** for a long time, but now with political upheavals in HOPE's state, coal mines are shut down and power's being limited statewide. At this time (mid-October) the power is off about 7 hrs a day at HOPE, causing various issues, and the political issues intensify. Prices are from about \$2,500 for a used generator (if we can find a good one) up to \$4,500 for a new one, large enough for HOPE needs. **2.** Each year we try to provide a new set of clothes for all the children, widows & staff, bonuses for the staff and a special meal for all. PROFILES OF THE HOPE NEST



Yesuprema (7-4-98): Name meaning, "love of JESUS". Her father left when she was small, the mother later leaving her with grandparents (fruit sellers & very poor). Came to HOPE in 2001 at 3 yrs old. When small had major seizures, but now healed. PTL! In 10th class.



Moses (3-1-10): His mother was a teenager who had been drugged and raped, thus conceiving Moses. Her parents wanted to be able to get the girl married, but a baby would make it difficult. So they asked the hospital to try and find someone to take the baby after birth.



The hospital called HOPE, so the same day we came home with a sweet little boy. He's been a little more sickly than most children, but now at 19 months is doing great. PTL!

MANNA PROGRAM PROFILES



MARTHAMMA: Perhaps in her mid-70's, a widow for almost 30 years. Very few of the widows know their birthdays or years, so there's a lot of guesswork. Marthamma ("Martha" and "amma", a respectful term added to the name of an elderly woman) has no children and lives in a small rented hut that's attached to someone's house. Pray for her.

ANNAMANIAMMA: About 80, and a widow since around 1995. Has one son & one daughter, the son in another village & the daughter very poor with 6 children of her own. Annamaniamma stayed on the verandah at the house where her daughter's family stayed, until she was told to leave. She now lives at HOPE and has a very thankful heart. She's very helpful with sweeping & cutting veggies.
